

A CALL TO ACTION

The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) has made it eminently clear:

If Mantoloking can meet the DEP's requirements for public beach access, Mantoloking's beach will be widened and improved and the entire community will be better protected from storms and rising sea level.

In this, my fourth and final mailing in this series, my objective is to encourage all local property owners and residents to take an active role in restoring and protecting our beach and to provide you with some resources to enable you to do so.

Here's what you will find enclosed:

- A resolution approved by unanimous vote of the **Mayor and Council** of the Borough of Mantoloking committing themselves to whatever action is necessary to secure funding for and implement a beach nourishment project for the Borough,
- A letter to Mantoloking residents from the Mantoloking **Beach Protection Committee** inviting all "to unite to protect our homes, our environment, our town, and our lifestyle" which includes detailed information on the current beach environment, the potential future environment, the beach improvement implementation plan, and benefits for Mantoloking property owners,
- An invitation to attend one of four **public meetings** to be held during the first week in August at which residents will learn more about the beach replenishment project directly from the key governmental and professional persons responsible for it,
- A model **easement agreement** which beachfront property owners will be required to sign to facilitate the initial beach nourishment and subsequent renourishments,
- A map showing Mantoloking's **public beach access** accommodations which has been submitted to the Department of Environmental Protection.

I hope you find this information useful, will attend one or more of the public meetings on beach protection, and will support and encourage your neighbors to support our efforts to improve Mantoloking's beaches and protect the entire town.
