All council members attended this meeting, called to order by Mayor Nebel at 4:30 p.m. The minutes of the February meeting were approved.

Council President Donald Ness moved a resolution to express appreciation for the service of John Kerr, Jr. who died March 1, 2011. He was a Borough Councilman from 1993 to 1998, was Council President for two years and served on several committees. The Mayor and Council extend their sincere condolences to his family.

Councilman Witkowski moved five resolutions; the report of Municipal Finance Officer Swisher; the payment of \$262,521 bills for March; adopt temporary emergency appropriations #1 for \$1,439,000 prior to the adoption of the budget; to adopt a temporary capital budget #1 of \$319,000; and to approve bylaw amendments to the New Jersey Intergovernmental Insurance Fund.

A resolution to adopt Ordinance #594, to exceed the 2011 Municipal Budget appropriation limits and to establish a Cap Bank was passed after a public hearing. And, Bond Ordinance #596, providing for purchase of computer equipment to cost \$26,000 was passed on first reading.

Councilman Gillingham moved two resolutions; the appointment of seasonal/part time help and to award a contract for Miscellaneous Supply, Service and Maintenance for an Animal Control Officer and use of facility.

Police Chief Wright reported total incidents for February were 141. Of these, 35 were "time cards," 44 were building checks, one was criminal mischief, one, disorderly conduct, three, ordinance violations, three suspicious persons.

Fire Chief Popaca said the Fire Company responded to ten fire calls, held two training drills and one business meeting. There were three fire alarms, two wires down, a water main break, a furnace fire, a gas leak and a smell of gas, and a cover for Brick Fire Company.

Councilwoman Nelson of Public Works moved a resolution to award a three-year contract for provision of inspections and remedial services for all fire protection systems, to Allied Fire and Safety Equipment. A resolution to award a three-year contract for provision of remedial services for all hard-wired telephone systems to GTS Telephone Inc. Both were passed. A resolution to introduce 2011 Capital Ordinances authorizing bonds and notes for #595, Old Bridge Street and Bay Avenue; #597, replace the fire house apron; #598, improvements to sanitary sewer system facilities; #599, providing for flap valve program; #600, construction of ADA walkway #4; all for total cost of \$293,000 of bonds and notes. Some of this will be paid with grant monies.

Construction Official wardell issued eight new and four updated

permits during February, for siding, interior renovations, electrical updates, plumbing updates, sprinklers, alarm systems, demolition, etc.

Land Use Officer Marinaccio reported he received 18 applications in February. Fourteen were approved, four were denied and three violations were issued.

Councilman Strohm said the meeting he was planning with the DEP was postponed and will be rescheduled. He reported that a letter is to be sent to dune violators. He moved a resolution to award a contract to Giles & Ransome, Inc. to provide for leased earth-moving equipment for emergency dune restoration. The resolution was passed.

Councilman Witkowski said the budget meetings are going well and he will have the proposed budget by April's council meeting.

Joyce Popaca, Mantoloking's representative to the Point Pleasant Beach School District where the Borough's three children attend school, asked residents to PLEASE vote on Wednesday, APRIL 27th, YES for the school budget and the candidate on the ballot. PPB is expecting a large write-in vote, not a good omen for Mantoloking tax payers.

The meeting was adjourned at 4.55 p.m. The next regular Council Meeting is Monday, April 18, 2011 at 4:30 p.m.
