Mantoloking & Super Storm Sandy – Bay Update

- Work as been completed:
 - 315,887 cy debris
 - 240,000 cy sand
 - \$33.3 Million (all of Zone 4) debris removal, dredging, monitoring and project management.
- Crowder will spend next week cleaning up temporary sites.
- NJ DEP / FEMA are satisfied that they have removed all safety



Mantoloking & Super Storm Sandy – Debris & un-safe structures

- A revaluation was complete for the 3rd time.
- Construction Department has sent out several unsafe structure letters already.
- Letters will be sent through the Board of Health to homes with;
 - Large amounts of debris
 - Un-kept properties
 - Properties with vermin living inside



GOAL: Properties cleared by end of year!

Mantoloking & Super Storm Sandy – Rt. 35 Construction

- OEM, Police, Fire & The Mayor will be meeting every Wednesday with NJDOT officials for updates, and post any important info on Web & Facebook pages.
- Traffic pattern changes daily, please drive safely!
- Automobile accidents have increased with the congestion: leave room to stop.
- Two current work zones:
 - Lyman to Johnson
 - Downer to Princeton

Mantoloking & Super Storm Sandy - Safety

- We are seeing an increase in fires in the area
- Some residents have reported sediment in their drinking water, if you have also please;
 - first report the problem to NJ American Water
 - second you can have your plumber install a water filter on the line.
- Winter is here! DPW & police are reporting several water leaks. Please use caution
- If you have repopulated and not reported it to the town please note that electrical inspections need to be performed along with sanitary sewer lines. Failure to do so may result in a service interruption.
- Please make sure your address is clearly displayed in a visible location.



Recovery by the Numbers

- ❖ Mantoloking has received;
 - ❖ NJDOT Rt. 35 project - \$40 Million
 - ❖ NJDEP water way debris - \$33.3 Million in zone 4
 - ❖ NJDEP Metal Sheeting - \$ 22 Million in Mantoloking / \$40 million Total
 - ❖ Army Corp Beach Project - \$40 Million
 - ❖ FEMA Public Assistance - \$3.9 million received / \$4 Million pending PW completion
