Mantoloking Recovery – Rt. 35 Construction

- Work will continue till May 22nd
- No work will be performed from Downer north to Lyman until after Labor Day
- The traffic pattern has switched as of Saturday NB traffic is now on the SB side.
- Rt. 35 from Downer to Carpenter is paved along with Downer St.



Mantoloking Recovery – Rt. 35 Construction

- OEM, Police, & Fire continue to hold meetings every Wednesday with NJDOT officials for updates and to pass along public safety issues
- Traffic pattern changes daily, please drive safely! Please continue to use caution while driving through town as we are sharing the roads with large trucks & equipment.
- Automobile accidents have increased with the congestion: leave extra room for stopping as trucks come in & out of the construction zones without warning.

Mantoloking Recovery - Beach

- 6,000 Cubic yds. recently trucked in and placed in the most vulnerable areas
- Average height 16 – 18'
- Average width 30 -35'
- States contractor continues to haul and drop sand to the beach at **no cost** to the Boro.
- DPW will continue to push at low tide when sand is available.




Mantoloking Recovery - Sheeting

Mantoloking Recovery – Debris

- OCHD has inspected several properties in town and will send letters to homes with;
 - Large amounts of debris &
 - Properties with vermin living inside
- OCHD will does not regulate mold
- Please talk to your neighbors directly if possible.
- The town has spent 3 million dollars on debris removal. Debris left on properties is the responsibility of the homeowner!
