### **Meeting Minutes**

#### Japanese Black Pines

- John reported that All Jersey Shore Tree Removal ground out about 25 stumps on the south end of town on and adjacent to his property.
- There are a couple of properties on Ocean Ave. (south of the "Asian" inspired new build) that require clean-up. Doug Nelson has indicated that he will contact that owner.

#### 2020 Roots for Rivers Reforestation Grant

• Returning of unspent grant (\$69.70): Haley has been reaching out (email and phone) to Kaitlyn Vollmer weekly to determine how to handle this and has received no response to date. She will try the Sustainable Jersey general number.



• Timing of removal of Bunny Guards: Beth and Haley indicated that until the plants can fend for themselves and are growing outside of the seams, the guards are left in place. Generally speaking, this takes two or three years. Bottomline, they are not being removed anytime soon.

## **ANJEC Climate Change Bill Guidance**

• This guidance has not yet been published.

### Preservation of Swan Point

- Jan asked that this be added to the agenda and is interested in heading up this project.
- As per an article published in the Ocean Star, Dennis Blazak (current chair of the Pt Pleasant Borough EC and the Community Plans and Liaison Officer at Naval Weapons Station Earle), shepherded the creation of the branch box breakwater at Slade Dale Sanctuary and an oyster castle project at IBSP (Island Beach State Park). This project was funded by the American Littoral Society (ALS).
- He (Dennis Blazak) and the NJDEP are working with the DOD, Department of the Interior, and the Department of Agriculture to combine funding for projects such as the preservation of the Swan Point State Natural Area.
- Accordingly, six projects have already been approved for Fiscal Year 2022 but there might be an opportunity for Swan Point starting in FY23 (Oct. 2022)...there is already a "notional" project planned by the NJDEP for Swan Point.
- Even though Swan Point falls in Brick, because it's state property, we have the potential opportunity to drive this project forward and ultimately provide manpower in setting up some sort of natural barrier (oyster castles?) to the wave action.
