# Swan Point Oyster Array (Preservation of Swan Point Project)

- According to an email from Denise Blazak on 7/28 that Jan O'Malley shared with the group:
  - Four towns are supporting this project to date: Mantoloking, BH, Point Boro, and Brick.
  - Once they know the total cost (at least \$25K), they will then be focusing on identifying funding. DOD dollars remain a possibility, especially in Fiscal Year 2022.
