**RESOLUTION NO. 2021-66**

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SELF-EXAMINATION OF THE 2021 BUDGET**

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-78b has authorized the Local Finance Board to adopt rules that permit municipalities in sound fiscal condition to assume the responsibility, normally granted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, of conducting the annual budget examination; and

**WHEREAS**, N.J.A.C. 5:30-7 was adopted by the Local Finance Board on February 11, 1997; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 through 7.5, the Borough of Mantoloking has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local Government Services, and the Chief Financial officer has determined that the local government meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2021 budget year.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the governing body of the Borough of Mantoloking that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & 7.6b and based upon the Chief Financial Officer's certification, the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:
  - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
  - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
  - c. Cash deficit of preceding year
  - d. Reserve for uncollected taxes
  - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
  - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes.
2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.3 et seq., are fully met (complies with CAP law).
3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
  - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate and correctly stated,
  - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth
  - c. In itemization, form, arrangement and content, the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.
5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced and publicly advertised in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that a copy of this resolution will be forwarded to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services upon adoption.

**WHEREAS**, the members of the governing body have familiarized themselves with the contents of the above-referenced enforcement guidance and with their local unit's hiring practices as they pertain to the consideration of an individual's criminal history, as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto.

**INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCE NO. 721**

**CALENDAR YEAR 2021**

**ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A  
CAP BANK**

**(N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)**

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 1.0% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mantoloking in the County of Ocean, finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2021 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mantoloking hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$161,615.27 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mantoloking hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mantoloking, in the County of County, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2021 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Mantoloking shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5 %, amounting to \$161,615.27, and that the CY 2021 municipal budget for the Borough of Mantoloking be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included hereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

CFO, April Yezzi, explained noted that this resolution is to establish a cap bank and really has no impact on any of the expenditures in the 2021 budget. It is to help with the cap bank for 2022 and 2023.

Notice is hereby given that the budget and tax resolution was approved by the governing body of the Borough of Mantoloking, County of Ocean on April 20, 2021.

A hearing on the budget and tax resolution will be held at the Mantoloking Municipal Building located at 202 Downer Avenue, Mantoloking, New Jersey on May 18, 2021 at 5:30 PM at which time and place objections to the budget and tax resolution for the year 2021 may be presented by taxpayers or other interested persons. Due to the public health emergency from the COVID-19 virus, this meeting may be conducted by telephonic means.

Information to access and participate in the meeting is posted on the Borough's website [www.mantoloking.org](http://www.mantoloking.org).

Copies of the budget are available in the office of the Municipal Clerk, located at the Mantoloking Municipal Building, 202 Downer Avenue, Mantoloking, New Jersey 08738, 732-475-6983, during the hours of 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM.

Councilman Amarante reported that the total number of employees full time and part time as printed in the agenda are switched. The number for 2021 should be 78, 2020 should be 95. The reason there are less employees this year is because we are no longer employing lifeguards ourselves.

Councilman Amarante read the following budget statement:

### 2021 Budget Introduction

I would like to thank April and all the departments for their efforts to complete the budget for introduction today. I appreciate their time devoted to our meetings and their expertise which allows us to introduce a budget which increases spending by over \$325,000 versus the 2020 budget without proposing any reduction in services and does not increase the local tax rate.

We used a new process this year which I believe was beneficial. Department budget requests were collected by April and then disseminated to the mayor and all council members by standing committee for review before being discussed by the Finance Committee. I thank those that gave valuable input during this process.

I would like to review some revenue assumptions and highlight some extraordinary expense items included in the proposed budget. All increases in expenses noted are compared to the 2020 budget:

#### Revenue Assumptions

- \$690,000 of our surplus balance of \$1,407,063 is proposed to be used to support the 2021 budget.
- Anticipated beach badge revenues are \$273,200.

- OCCARES Grant for Digitization \$71,328 - We were able to obtain this grant to begin digitization of our paper records. The initial areas digitized will be those related to the Clerk, Finance and the Construction Departments.
- Our first reimbursement from the OCCARES program of \$131,572 is included as miscellaneous revenue. There will be additional reimbursements received in 2021.
- Miscellaneous revenue of \$106,500 from the sale of municipal assets is included. We had discussed this as the way to support the purchase of the new police boat. I note that there is still approximately \$228,000 remaining as a reserve in this account.

### **Expense Items**

- **Pensions & Retirement - Police & Fireman's Retirement System** – There is an increase of \$80,280. This amount is provided by the State of NJ and is out of our direct control.
  - **Employee Group Health** – There is an increase of \$40,262.
  - **Computer Technology / Data Breach** - \$25,000 insurance deductible that we are responsible for as a result of the data breach. \$63,650 is included for required equipment and software upgrades and the IT shared services agreement approved with Freehold Township.
  - **Beach Operations** – Increase of almost \$50,000 primarily due to outsourcing of lifeguard services. I note that although the proposed budget forecasts a small deficit in beach operations, we expect that the operations will be self-funding when actual revenue and expenses are finalized.
  - **Police** - \$17,400 budgeted for the final phase of the Police Accreditation process. Thanks to the Chief and the department for all the work that has gone into this process.
  - **Coastal Engineering** – Increase of about \$60,000.
- ❖ Work related to planning for next planned renourishment currently scheduled for 2022.
  - ❖ Additional required work for changes in the Community Rating System for the National Flood Insurance Program.
  - ❖ Addition of a dune fertilization program.

Mayor White also express his thanks and noted that there are a lot of moving parts to the budget. There was a breach that was unforeseen and was handled. Councilwoman O'Mealia put a committee together and ran it. It has been very successful in getting us to where we need to be. We have handled the financial component. He thanked everyone and Councilman Amarante as well, as chairman of that committee. He does a great job and works very hard as does everybody. This group is to be highly commended for their work.

**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A SPECIAL EMERGENCY  
APPROPRIATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$60,000.00 FOR THE RECODIFICATION  
OF EXISTING ORDINANCES FOR THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING,  
COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY  
N.J.S.A. 40A:4-53**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Borough of Mantoloking Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mantoloking, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to the Local Budget Law of New Jersey, and in particular N.J.S.A. 40A:53, a special emergency appropriation in the amount of \$60,000.00 is hereby authorized and made for the purpose of recodification of existing ordinances, for the Borough of Mantoloking, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey;

Section 2. The Borough is hereby authorized to finance such appropriation from surplus funds available or by issuing special emergency notes from time to time in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-55, all as shall be determined by and pursuant to a resolution or resolutions of the Borough to be hereafter adopted. The authorization to finance the appropriation shall be provided for in succeeding annual budgets by the inclusion of at least 1/5 of the amount authorized pursuant to N.J.S.A 40A:4-55.

Section 3. In accordance with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-53, a copy of this ordinance as finally adopted shall be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect after publication after final adoption, as provided by law.

Councilman Amarante explained the reason for the special emergency, April's suggestion, and verified by the Auditor. By doing a special emergency the borough is allowed to raise the \$60,000 in the budget over a period of 5 years.

Borough Attorney Cipriani commented on the reason for doing the codification it will be extremely beneficial for the borough in a variety of ways. A quick review of the code shows that there are some structural problems. The code does not provide for any departments except for the Police Department and the Fire Company. The Noise Ordinance needs to be looked at regarding decibel basis which is not really enforceable. Conflicts in littering with 2 ordinances in Chapter 2 that prohibit littering, which carry very different fines.

Disrobing or nudity on the beach in 2 separate ordinances one under beach regulation chapter and one under police regulation chapter which cover the same ground, but have different language, different definitions discharging a weapon in the Borough of Mantoloking if the Mayor gives you written permission.

Board of Health section

This will provide an opportunity for ordinances we don't have that are beneficial.

#### **ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE NO. 718**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, SO AS TO AMEND CHAPTER 20, ENTITLED "SEWERS" SO AS TO UPDATE SEWER FEES**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Mantoloking, County of Ocean, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

**SECTION 1.** Section 20-3 of Chapter 20 of the Borough Code of the Borough of Mantoloking,

**20-2.3 Connection Fees and Costs.**

- a. All costs shall be borne by the owner of the premises served.
- b. The fee for connecting to the sanitary sewerage system shall be **one hundred (\$100.00)** dollars. This fee includes the fee for inspection of this connection.

**SECTION 2.** Section 20-5 of Chapter 20 of the Borough Code of the Borough of Mantoloking, entitled, "Sewers" is hereby amended and supplemented so as to read in its entirety as follows:

**20-2.5 User Rates and Charges.**

- a. All owners of improved premises subject to connection and who have not connected and paid shall pay a pro rated annual sewer charge. The pro rated charge shall be due and payable from the expiration of the six (6) month period and shall be paid in full not later than seven (7) months from the announcement of availability of connection.
- b.1. There are hereby established the following annual rates and charges to be imposed by the Borough for the use and service of the sanitary sewerage system:

The minimum charge per unit shall be **two hundred sixty dollars and seventy-one cents (\$260.71)** annually. In addition to the minimum charge each user shall pay a fee of **\$15.53 (fifteen dollars and fifty-three cents)** per fixture for all fixtures over four (4) exclusive of the laundry facility and one (1) dishwasher.

2. The annual sewer charge based on the type of property shall be as follows: ("X" indicates one (1) unit)

	Annual <u>Rental Charge</u>
(a) Single-family dwelling, apartment unit, (an apartment unit will be deemed any living unit having cooking facilities)	1X
(b) Commercial Establishments-Retail stores	1X
(c) Churches	1X
(d) Yacht Clubs	1.5

3. In addition to the foregoing charges, any user who discharges toxic pollutants into the system which causes increased operations and maintenance costs shall be responsible for such increased operation and maintenance costs.

c. Each user shall be provided with an annual statement of the sewer charges. The annual sewer charges shall be due and payable on May 1st of each year and shall become delinquent unless paid on or before the expiration of the grace

period allowed for payment of third quarter property taxes. Failure to timely pay the sewer charges will expose the property to a municipal lien sale. Delinquent sewer accounts shall accrue interest at the rate of twelve (12%) percent per annum.

**SECTION 3.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 4.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

**SECTION 5.** This ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by law.

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING AND THE TOWNSHIP OF MANCHESTER FOR THE USE OF MANCHESTER TOWNSHIP FIREARMS RANGE FACILITY**

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 40:8A-1 authorizes municipalities to enter into an agreement, among other things, for sharing of services; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Mantoloking is desirous to enter into an Interlocal Services Agreement for the use of the Township of Manchester Firearms Range Facility; and

**WHEREAS**, both the Borough of Mantoloking and the Township of Manchester agree to abide by all terms and conditions in said agreement.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the governing body of the Borough of Mantoloking, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute and the clerk attest to the Interlocal Service Agreement with the Township of Manchester for use of the Township of Manchester Firearms Range Facility.



2. That the term of said agreement will be for a period of three years commencing January 1, 2021 and ending December 31, 2023.

**RESOLUTION NO. 2021-73**

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, URGING THE IMMEDIATE REPEAL OF SENATE BILL NO. 3454 (P.L. 2021 C. 25)**

**WHEREAS**, Public Question 1, the “Marijuana Legalization Amendment,” was on the ballot in New Jersey as a

legislatively referred constitutional amendment on November 3, 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, the text of the ballot question provided as follows:

**CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO LEGALIZE MARIJUANA**

Do you approve amending the Constitution to legalize a controlled form of marijuana called “cannabis”?

Only adults at least 21 years of age could use cannabis. The State commission created to oversee the State’s medical cannabis program would also oversee the new, personal use cannabis market.

Cannabis products would be subject to the State sales tax. If authorized by the Legislature, a municipality may pass a local ordinance to charge a local tax on cannabis products.

**WHEREAS**, Public Question 1 was approved (67.08% Yes votes and 32.92% No votes); and

**WHEREAS**, on February 22, 2021, Governor Phil Murphy signed into law legislation legalizing and regulating cannabis use and possession for adults 21 years and older (A-21, The New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act) and decriminalizing marijuana and hashish possession (A-1897). The Governor also signed S-3454, addressing marijuana and cannabis use and possession penalties for individuals younger than 21 years old and imposing criminal penalties on law enforcement officers; and

**WHEREAS**, Senate Bill No. 3454 was voted on, passed and signed into law with less than one hour left before the legalization of marijuana was scheduled to become law; and

**WHEREAS**, the legislation is treacherous to law enforcement officers because it creates a penalty of 3rd Degree Deprivation of Civil Rights if an officer uses the odor or possession of marijuana or alcoholic beverages as the reason for initiating an investigatory stop of a person. The new law states that a law enforcement officer cannot use the odor of marijuana or alcohol as reasonable articulable suspicion to initiate an investigatory stop. The new law states a minor cannot

consent to be searched and that a law enforcement officer no longer has probable cause to search a minor for illegally using marijuana or alcohol. And if an officer violates a minor’s rights by using pot or alcohol as the reason for a search then the officer will be charged with the crime of deprivation of civil rights; and

**WHEREAS**, Senate Bill No. 3454 establishes penalties of only warnings for illegal use by minors of marijuana or alcohol but it essentially prevents an officer from even approaching a person suspected of being a minor. The smell of marijuana and its use in the presence of a law enforcement officer will no longer be grounds to search an individual. While marijuana is now legal for those 21 and older Senate Bill No. 3454 is an assault on law enforcement’s ability to enforce the law. Senate Bill No. 3454 is an attack on law enforcement officers by making law enforcement officers the target of punishment rather than the individuals breaking the law. This language will have dangerous consequences for the public and law enforcement officers.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Borough Council of the Borough of Mantoloking, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, finds as follows:

1. Senate Bill No. 3454 was passed with little to no discussion, no public transparency, and no public debate.
2. Senate Bill No. 3454 unfairly and unreasonably imposes criminal penalties on law enforcement officers if they are found to have violated new rules dictating underage possession. The odor of cannabis or alcohol will no longer be enough to justify a search. The same holds true for “the unconcealed possession” of an alcoholic beverage, marijuana, hashish or cannabis item, according to the bill text.
3. Senate Bill No. 3454 turns law enforcement officers into criminals. It establishes a legal set of enforcement powers, but it criminalizes the actual enforcement of those powers.
4. Senate Bill No. 3454 goes well beyond the express terms of the ballot question and the intent of New Jersey’s voters when they approved the question.
5. Governor Murphy and the State Legislature should take urgent steps to repeal Senate Bill No. 3454 to protect our children and law enforcement officers.
6. A certified copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to Governor Phil Murphy, the State Legislature, Ocean County Board of Commissioners, NJ State League of Municipalities, NJ Municipal Management Association, and NJ State PBA.

#### **INTRODUCTION TO ORDINANCE NO. 723**

#### **AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, SO AS TO AMEND CHAPTER 3, ENTITLED “POLICE REGULATIONS”**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Mantoloking, County of Ocean, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

**SECTION 1.** The Municipal Code of the Borough of Mantoloking is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 3 entitled “Police Regulations”, in order to amend § 3-1.4 entitled “Public Nuisances Prohibited” in order to add subsection h. which shall read as follows:

#### **h. Cannabis Consumption.**

##### **1. Definitions**

##### **CANNABIS ITEM**

Any item available for lawful consumption pursuant to the NJ Cannabis regulatory enforcement assistance and marketplace modernization act.

### **INDOOR PUBLIC PLACE**

A structurally enclosed place of business, commerce or other service-related activity, whether publicly or privately owned or operated on a for-profit or nonprofit basis, which is generally accessible to the public,

including, but not limited to: a commercial or other office building; office or building owned, leased or rented by the State or by a county or municipal government; theater or concert hall; public library; museum or art gallery; bar; restaurant or other establishment where the principal business is the sale of food for consumption on the premises, including the bar area of the establishment; garage or parking facility; any public conveyance operated on land or water, or in the air, and passenger waiting rooms and platform areas in any stations or terminals thereof; health care facility; patient waiting room of the office of a health care provider; child care center; race track facility; facility used for the holding of sporting events; ambulatory

recreational facility; shopping mall or retail store; hotel, motel or other lodging establishment; apartment building lobby or other public area in an otherwise private building; or a passenger elevator in a building other than a single-family dwelling.

### **2. Consumption of cannabis items in a public place unlawful.**

It is unlawful for any person over the age of 21 to consume, other than by smoking, vaping, or aerosolizing, any cannabis item in a public place, including any indoor public place, other than school property, or when not prohibited by the owner or person responsible for the operation of the public place.

### **3. Violations and penalties.**

A. Violations of this section shall be punished by a civil penalty of \$200.

B. All fines and penalties under this chapter may be paid directly to the Municipal Court Administrator, unless otherwise indicated by the officer issuing the summons.

**SECTION 2.** The Municipal Code of the Borough of Mantoloking is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 3 entitled “Police Regulations”, in order to add § 3-10 which shall be entitled “Possession and Consumption by Minors” and which shall read as follows:

### **§ 3-10 Possession and Consumption by Minors.**

#### **§ 3-10.1 Definitions.**

As used in this article, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

#### **CANNABIS ITEM**

Any item available for lawful consumption pursuant to the NJ Cannabis regulatory enforcement assistance and marketplace modernization act.

#### **GUARDIAN**

A person who has qualified as a guardian of the underage person pursuant to a testamentary or court appointment.

**RELATIVE**

The underage person's grandparent, aunt or uncle, sibling or any other person related by blood or affinity.

**§ 3-10.2 Consumption of alcoholic beverages by underage person on private property prohibited.**

It is unlawful for any person under the legal age to, without legal authority, knowingly possess or knowingly

consume an alcoholic beverage or a cannabis item, other than by smoking, vaping or aerosolizing, on private property.

**§ 3-10.3 Violations and penalties.**

- A. Any person found guilty of violating the terms of this section involving alcoholic beverage activity shall, in the case of an adult under the legal age to purchase an alcoholic beverage, be subject to a fine of \$250 for a first offense and a fine of \$350 for any subsequent offense.
- B. For a violation involving cannabis activity, in the case of an adult under the legal age to purchase cannabis items, shall be punished as follows:
  1. If the cannabis item possessed is an amount which may be lawfully possessed by a person of the legal age to purchase cannabis items:
    - a. For a first offense: a civil penalty of \$100
    - b. For a second offense: a civil penalty of \$200.
    - c. For a third or subsequent offense: a fine of \$350.
  2. If the cannabis item possessed is an amount that exceeds what may be lawfully possessed by a person of the legal age to purchase cannabis items:
    - a. For a first offense: a fine of \$250
    - b. For a second or subsequent offense: a fine of \$350.
- C. In addition, the court may, upon a finding of guilt, in addition to the fine authorized for this offense, suspend or postpone for six months the driving privileges of the defendant. Upon the conviction of any person and the suspension or postponement of that person's driver's license, the court shall forward a report to the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission stating the first and last day of the suspension or postponement period imposed by the court pursuant to this section. If a person at the time of the imposition of a sentence is less than 17 years of age, the period of license postponement, including a suspension or postponement of the privilege of operating a motorized bicycle, shall commence on the day the sentence is imposed and shall run for a period of six months after the person reaches the age of 17 years. If the defendant at the time of the imposition of the sentence has a valid driver's license issued by this state, the court shall immediately collect the license and forward it to the Commission along with the report. If for any reason the license cannot be collected, the court shall include in the report the complete name, address, date of birth, eye color, and sex of the person, as well as the first and last date of the license suspension period imposed by the court.

- D. The court shall inform the person orally and in writing that if the person is convicted of operating a motor vehicle during the period of license suspension or postponement, the person shall be subject to the penalties set forth in N.J.S.A. 39:3-40. The defendant shall be required to acknowledge receipt of the written notice in writing. Failure to receive a written notice or failure to acknowledge in writing the receipt of the written notice shall not be a defense to a subsequent charge of a violation of N.J.S.A. 39:3-40.
- E. If the person convicted under this section is not a New Jersey resident, the court shall suspend or postpone, as appropriate, the nonresident driving privilege of the person based on the age of the person and submit to the Division the required report. The court shall not collect the license of a nonresident convicted under this section. Upon receipt of a report by the court, the Division shall notify the appropriate officials in the licensing jurisdiction of the suspension or postponement.

**§ 3-10.4 Exceptions.**

- A. This section shall not prohibit an underage person from consuming or possessing an alcoholic beverage in connection with a religious observance, ceremony or rite or consuming or possessing an alcoholic beverage in

the presence of and with the permission of a parent, guardian or relative who has attained the legal age to purchase and consume alcoholic beverages.

- B. This section shall not prohibit the possession of alcoholic beverages by any underage person while actually engaged in the performance of employment by a person who was licensed under Title 33 of the revised statutes or while actively engaged in the preparation of food while enrolled in a culinary arts or hotel management program at a county vocational school or post-secondary educational institution; however, this article shall not be construed to preclude the imposition of a penalty under this section, N.J.S.A. 33:1-81, or any other section of law against a person who is convicted of unlawful alcoholic beverage activity on or at premises licensed for the sale of alcoholic beverages.

**§ 3-10.5 Underage possession or consumption; exemption from prosecution.**

- A. An underage person and one or two other persons, if applicable, shall be immune from prosecution under this chapter prohibiting any person under the legal age who, without legal authority, knowingly possesses or knowingly consumes an alcoholic beverage or cannabis item on private property if:

(1) One of the underage persons called 911 and reported that another underage person was in need of medical assistance due to alcohol consumption or the consumption of a cannabis item;

(2) The underage person who called 911 and, if applicable, one or two other persons acting in concert with the underage person who called 911 provided each of their names to the 911 operator;

(3) The underage person was the first person to make the 911 report; and

(4) The underage person and, if applicable, one or two other persons acting in concert with the underage

person who made the 911 call remained on the scene with the person under the legal age in need of medical assistance until assistance arrived and cooperated with medical assistance and law enforcement personnel on the scene.

B. The underage person who received medical assistance as provided in Subsection A of this section shall also be immune from prosecution under this chapter prohibiting the possession or consumption of an alcoholic beverage on private property.

**SECTION 3.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 4.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

**SECTION 5.** This ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by law.

**WHEREAS**, the Borough Attorney has recommended that Joseph D. Coronato, Sr, Esquire, be appointed as Special Counsel for the representation of the Borough in matters regarding which the Borough Attorney has a conflict or other matters as assigned; and

**WHEREAS**, the performance of the services requires knowledge of an advanced type in a field of learning pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-2 and the Borough has determined that Joseph D. Coronato, Sr, Esquire of the firm Coronato Law has the ability and expertise to perform the legal services required by the Borough; and

**WHEREAS**, Joseph D. Coronato, Sr, Esquire, of the firm of Coronato Law, has completed and submitted a Business Entity Disclosure Certification which certifies that neither he nor his firm has made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in the Borough of Mantoloking in the previous one year, and that the contract will prohibit Joseph D. Coronato, Sr, Esquire, and the firm of Coronato Law from making any reportable contributions to a



political or candidate committee in the Borough of Mantoloking through the term of the contract; and

**WHEREAS**, the Chief Financial Officer has certified that there are funds available for this contract, which certification is annexed hereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq., authorizes the award of contracts for “Professional Services” and requires that the resolution and contract be made available for public inspection.

The Special Counsel and his firm shall be compensated at the rate of One Hundred Seventy-Five (\$175.00) Dollars per hour for services rendered to the Borough, for a total amount not to exceed \$17,500.00 without further resolution.
2. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute and the Borough Clerk to attest to, respectively, the attached agreement with Joseph D. Coronato, Sr, Esquire of the firm of Coronato Law in accordance with the provisions of this resolution.
3. That this contract is awarded without competitive bidding as a “Professional Service” in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5(1)(a)(i) of the Local Public Contracts law because it is for services to be performed by a person or persons authorized by law to practice a recognized profession.
4. That the Business Disclosure Entity Certification be placed on file with this resolution.
5. That a notice of this action shall be printed once in the official newspaper of the Borough of Mantoloking.
6. That a copy of the written determination of value by the Borough shall be placed on file with this resolution.
7. That this resolution shall become effective immediately.
8. That a certificate of availability of funds executed by the Chief Financial Officer is annexed hereto.

Councilman Nelson reported that there is a conflict with the Bay Head and Mantoloking Flood Mitigation project. Borough Attorney, Jean Cipriani, has a conflict and is unable to perform counsel for Mantoloking. They would like to appoint Joe Coronato, Esq. to handle the project. This it cover any expenses over and above what is in the grant. .

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 2021-75**

#### **A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING RENEWAL OF THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT WITH NEW JERSEY NATURAL GAS COMPANY**

**WHEREAS**, New Jersey Natural Gas Company has heretofore been granted a franchise and consent to lay, maintain and operate gas facilities in the Borough of Mantoloking; and

**WHEREAS**, New Jersey Natural Gas Company is desirous of extending and renewing the period of the consent to this municipality to exercise its franchise rights in the Borough of Mantoloking for the purpose of furnishing gas therein.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that New Jersey Natural Gas Company be and it is hereby authorized to lay, maintain and operate its conductors, mains and pipes, together with the appurtenances thereto, in all the public streets, alleys, squares and public places in this municipality which are under the control and jurisdiction of the Borough for the purpose of conducting gas, including natural gas, or any mixture of gases of various types and for the purpose of transmitting and distributing such gas in this municipality for a period of ten (10) years from the date hereof, upon the following terms and conditions:

1. That New Jersey Natural Gas Company shall agree that, in all cases in which street openings or excavations are made for the purposes aforesaid, that restoration of same will be conducted in accordance with the requirements of the Borough Ordinances in existence at the time of said excavation; and
2. That New Jersey Natural Gas Company shall conduct the work or the laying or maintaining of gas pipes therein in a careful and prudent manner; and
3. That New Jersey Natural Gas Company shall safeguard the public interest in continuous and uninterrupted service at and after the expiration of the term of the grant; and
4. That New Jersey Natural Gas Company shall maintain its property in good order throughout the full term of the grant; and
5. That New Jersey Natural Gas Company shall continuously afford safe, adequate and proper service at just and reasonable rates.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that this franchise consent, upon approval of the Board of Public Utilities of the State of New Jersey, shall supersede the Resolution granted by the Borough of Mantoloking on October 17, 2005; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that New Jersey Natural Gas Company shall file with the clerk of this municipality, within sixty (60) days from the date hereof, its acceptance of the terms and provisions of the franchise consent herein granted and its agreement to be bound by the terms and provisions thereof; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that this resolution shall not become effective until it is approved by the Board of Public Utilities of the State of New Jersey.

Councilman Nelson explained the resolution authorizing franchise with the New Jersey Natural Gas Company.

Councilwoman O'Mealia asked Councilman Nelson to clarify what he meant regarding project costs as it pertains to hiring special counsel. Councilman Nelson explained that an agreement with Bay Head is needed so any expenses in excess of what is in the grant has to be shared proportionately by Bay Head and Mantoloking based on where the work is done. Jean is Counsel to both Bay Head and Mantoloking and cannot negotiate.

Councilwoman O'Mealia asked where is the agreement between Mantoloking and Bay Head to which Councilman Nelson replied it will be forthcoming once Joe Coronato is appointed.

Councilwoman O'Mealia, this is an opportunity to hire such a counsel due to Jean's conflict, to which Borough Attorney Jean Cipriani replied yes. She began the process, so Bay Head is aware. The borough administrator would be in contact with Larry because there were too many questions for her to feel comfortable with representing either town. Councilman Amarante asked if this would be a major time situation or are these pretty much standard.

Borough Attorney Cipriani advised that it should not be time consuming, shared service agreements or agreement of this kind are very much standard. It really is a question of having Larry and the appropriate committee member talk to the engineer and administrator in Bay Head and then Joe or anyone representing Bay Head would draw up the agreement and a resolution in each town. You should have it by the next meeting.

**ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE NO. 719**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, SO AS TO AMEND CHAPTER 30 ENTITLED “LAND USE REGULATIONS.”**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Mantoloking, County of Ocean, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

**SECTION 1.** The Municipal Code of the Borough of Mantoloking is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 30, entitled “Land Use Regulations,” so as to amend § 30-2.2, entitled “Definitions; word usage” to amend the definition for Accessory Detached Building so that it shall read as follows:

**ACCESSORY DETACHED BUILDING**

A building or structure subordinate to and customarily incidental to the principal building or structure on the same lot. Where an accessory building is attached to the principal building, the accessory building shall be

considered a part of the principal building. The detached structure may not become attached to the principal dwelling unless it conforms to the principal building setbacks and coverage requirements. Accessory buildings in “V” zone areas as defined on the Borough’s Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM), with the exception of garages, may be constructed below the Base Flood Elevation provided that they meet FEMA Technical Bulletin 5(2020), or the latest amended or revised version. Garages shall also be defined as

accessory structures and when constructed in a “V” zone, shall comply with guidelines established in FEMA Technical Bulletin 9-08, or the latest amended or revised version.

**SECTION 2.** The Municipal Code of the Borough of Mantoloking is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 30, entitled “Land Use,” so as to amend § 30-4.9, entitled “Decks” to add subsection j. which shall read as follows:

- j. An as-built plan, prepared by a professional land surveyor licensed in the State of New Jersey, shall be submitted to the Land Use Officer to verify that the approved deck, including at-grade decks and decks over eight (8) inches above grade, was constructed in accordance with the approved deck permit, and the as-built plan shall provide an updated zoning schedule to demonstrate compliance with all applicable bulk standards for coverage.

**SECTION 3.** The Municipal Code of the Borough of Mantoloking is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 30, entitled “Land Use,” so as to amend § 30-4.10, entitled “Swimming Pools” to add subsection m. which shall read as follows:

- m. Swimming pools shall not be considered an accessory structure under the Land Use Regulations of the Borough of Mantoloking.

**SECTION 4.** The Municipal Code of the Borough of Mantoloking is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 30, entitled “Land Use,” so as to amend § 30-4.19, entitled “Hardscaping” to add subsection d. which shall read as follows:

- d. An as-built plan, prepared by a professional land surveyor licensed in the State of New Jersey, shall be submitted to the Land Use Officer to verify that the approved hardscaping was constructed in accordance with the approved hardscape permit, and the as-built plan shall provide an updated zoning schedule to demonstrate compliance with all applicable bulk standards for coverage.

**SECTION 5.** The Municipal Code of the Borough of Mantoloking is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 30, entitled “Land Use,” so as to amend § 30-5.3, entitled “Application Procedure” to add subsection f. which shall read as follows:

- f. At the time of application, the Planning/Zoning Board secretary will provide a copy of all site plan and/or subdivision application documents to the Mantoloking Borough Environmental Commission for review.

**SECTION 6.** The Municipal Code of the Borough of Mantoloking is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 30, entitled “Land Use,” so as to amend § 30-6.11 entitled “Accessory Uses and Accessory Structures” so as to amend subsection a. entitled “Accessory Use” so as to revise section 4. so as to read as follows:

- 4. The use and/or occupancy for the purpose of habitation of any boat, mobile home, camper, trailer, storage trailer or any other vehicle or structure, whether it is self-propelled or otherwise used or intended to be used as a conveyance, and so designed or constructed to permit its occupancy for the purpose of habitation, at any time within this Borough, whether the same is parked, placed, maintained or stored on public or private property within the Borough, and whether or not it is parked or placed in a garage or other structure, is prohibited as an accessory use.

**SECTION 7.** The Municipal Code of the Borough of Mantoloking is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 30, entitled “Land Use,” so as to amend § 30-6.11 entitled “Accessory Uses and Accessory Structures” so as to amend subsection a. entitled “Accessory Use” so as to delete subsections 5 and 9 in their entirety and replace with “Reserved” as follows:

5. Reserved

...

9. Reserved.

**SECTION 8.** The Municipal Code of the Borough of Mantoloking is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 30, entitled “Land Use,” so as to amend § 30-6.11 entitled “Accessory Uses and Accessory Structures” so as to amend subsection b. entitled “Accessory Structures” so as to amend subsections 3, 5, 6, 8, and 10 in their entirety so that they shall read as follows:

3. There may be only two (2) roofed accessory buildings on a given lot or on combined lots.

6. An attached garage may contain sanitary plumbing that conforms to the Flood Damage Prevention Code.

6. A detached accessory structure may not include sanitary plumbing facilities, i.e. toilets or urinals. It may contain sinks and/or showers that conform to the Flood Damage Prevention Code.

8. A boat lift and/or davit may be installed, maintained and utilized as a permitted accessory structure on developed waterfront lots except for developed lots with frontage on the North and South lagoons where only a single davit for personal watercraft may be installed, maintained and utilized. A boat lift and/or davit

shall not be counted in the total for allowable accessory uses or accessory structures as described in § 30-6.11(b)3 above.

10. Accessory buildings in "V" zone areas as defined on the Borough's Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM), with the exception of garages, may be constructed below the Base Flood Elevation provided that they meet FEMA Technical Bulletin5 (2020), or the latest amended or revised version. Garages shall also be defined as accessory structures and when constructed in a "V" zone, shall comply with guidelines established in FEMA Technical Bulletin 9-08, or the latest amended or revised version.

**SECTION 9.** The Municipal Code of the Borough of Mantoloking is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 30, entitled “Land Use,” so as to amend § 30-6.11 entitled “Accessory Uses and Accessory Structures” so as to amend subsection b. entitled “Accessory Structures” so as to delete subsection 11 in its entirety.

**SECTION 10.** The Municipal Code of the Borough of Mantoloking is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 30, entitled “Land Use,” so as to amend § 30-6.12 entitled “Building Height and Roofs” so as to amend subsection d. in its entirety so that it shall read as follows:

d. The roof structure shall consist of rafters with a uniform slope and which bear directly on the ceiling joists of the story below the roof, with the exception of gambrel roofs, which shall be permitted. The pitch of the structure’s principal roof shall be not less than six on twelve (6 on 12).

**SECTION 11.** The Municipal Code of the Borough of Mantoloking is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 30, entitled “Land Use,” so as to amend § 30-6.13 entitled “Fences” so as to amend subsections j. and k. in their entirety so that they shall read as follows:

j. No owner shall replace any existing fence without first obtaining a fence permit from the Land Use Officer. Prior to permit closeout, a final field inspection will be performed by the Land Use Officer to verify that the new fencing was constructed in accordance with the approved fence permit.

k. No owner may replace more than sixteen (16) linear feet of an existing fence in a consecutive 12 month period, unless the fence’s height complies with the provisions of this subsection. An owner may replace sixteen (16) linear feet or less of an existing fence in a consecutive 12 month period at the same height of the existing fence, even if the height does not comply with the provisions of this subsection.

**SECTION 12.** The Municipal Code of the Borough of Mantoloking is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 30, entitled “Land Use,” so as to amend § 30-6 entitled “Zoning Provisions” so as to add subsection § 30-6.18 which shall be entitled “Prohibited Uses” and which shall read as follows:

A. Cannabis Establishments. All classes of cannabis establishments, including cannabis cultivators, cannabis manufacturers, cannabis wholesalers, cannabis distributors and cannabis retailers are hereby prohibited from operating in the Borough of Mantoloking. This prohibition shall not apply to the delivery of cannabis items and supplies by a licensed cannabis delivery service.

B. Reserved

**SECTION 13.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 14.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

**SECTION 15.** This ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by law.

Borough Attorney Cipriani noted the accessory use issue in this ordinance also prohibits all classes of cannabis establishments within the Borough.

Scott Hulse, Public Works Manager, thanked Barbara Benz also for the beach sweeps. There was a great turn out. This time of year seals are washing up on the beach. If they are injured, there are 2 phone numbers to call. A dolphin washed yesterday. There are all kinds of sea creatures washing up. If you feel there is an emergency, call Mammal Stranding Center in Brigantine 609-266-0538, that is the emergency line. You can also call the police department on the non emergency line 732-295-1465, and public works and the police department will work together with the stranding center to take care of these issues.

PLEASE KNOW THAT I WILL VOTE NO ON THIS RESOLUTION BUT NOT BECAUSE I DON'T APPROVE OF THE PEOPLE BEING APPOINTED TO THE COMMITTEE. ON THE CONTRARY, I CONSIDER THEM SOME OF MANTOLOKING'S MOST CAPABLE AND ACCOMPLISHED.

INSTEAD, I WANT TO CONTINUE EXPRESSING MY CONVICTION THAT CREATING THE POSITION OF MUNICIPAL ADMINISTRATOR CONSTITUTES A PROPOSED CHANGE IN THE WAY MANTOLOKING CONDUCTS ITS BUSINESS AND IS A BAD IDEA AT A BAD TIME.

IT'S A BAD IDEA BECAUSE NO ELECTED OFFICIAL, STAFF MEMBER, RESIDENT, TAXPAYER, VENDOR, AUDITOR, OR OBSERVER HAS IDENTIFIED ANY PROBLEM, PRACTICE, OR SITUATION FOR A MUNICIPAL ADMINISTRATOR TO ADDRESS. THE SUGGESTION TO HIRE AN OUTSIDE ADMINISTRATOR FOR THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING WAS MADE BY THE RETIRED MUNICIPAL ADMINISTRATOR FROM THE CITY OF SUMMIT. HE FAILS TO CITE ANY SPECIFIC WAYS THE NEW POSITION WOULD BENEFIT MANTOLOKING.

IT'S A BAD TIME BECAUSE, IN THE SUMMIT ADMINISTRATOR'S WORDS: "*The Borough is fortunate to have a staff – although small – that operates efficiently and with a high degree of dedication to their respective roles and to the municipality as a whole.*" I SUGGEST OUR FIVE CURRENT FUNCTION SPECIFIC MUNICIPAL ADMINISTRATORS HAVE THE TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE IN THEIR AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY TO CARRY OUT THEIR FUNCTIONS AUTONOMOUSLY. THEY WORK TOGETHER WELL WHEN APPROPRIATE. THEY ARE THE MOST INFORMATIVE AND EFFECTIVE BOROUGH ADMINISTRATORS I HAVE ENCOUNTERED DURING 24 YEARS AS AN ELECTED OFFICIAL.

FINALLY, IT JUST DOES NOT MAKE SENSE FOR THE SMALLEST OF NEW JERSEY'S 565 MUNICIPALITIES, WITH 20 FULL-TIME EMPLOYEES EARNING SALARIES RANGING FROM \$59,000 TO \$162,000, AND ONE OF THE STATE'S 20 HIGHEST AND OCEAN COUNTY'S HIGHEST AVERAGE PROPERTY TAX BILLS TO BE CONSIDERING INCREASING RATHER THAN STABILIZING THE SIZE AND COST OF MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT.

12. **RECREATION COMMITTEE (Recreation, Beach, Beautification)**- Chairman Batcha will present the monthly reports.

Councilman Batcha reported that badge sales have started.

13. **MAYOR AND COUNCIL COMMENTS:**

Mayor White reported that we will have a very busy summer this year in terms people coming back to our beaches who perhaps were not coming previously. Luckily there is 2.2 miles of beaches and room to handle a lot more people than a lot of towns can. We also have a significant amount of construction in town. East Ave, Runyon, Barnegat Lane, we have to work with each other because the contractors parking is at a premium,

it is very difficult for these people to off load materials. We need to work with these people and that may mean that for 10-15 minutes on Barnegat Lane they will be responsible for notifying our police department and ask for help while they offload their materials. Chief Ferris will send one of her officers up there for traffic purposes and then they will hopefully do their jobs and do them quickly and move on. We need to get two things done, our residents in a position to build their houses but at the same time let the contractors do their job and do all of this safely. I think this summer will require patience on everybody's part. Work with each other, work with the contractors and work with our police. It will be a great summer and one that will be very busy.

Chief Ferris added specifically on parking they will be bringing the Class 1's in to do a hit of every house with a letter to the contractor's to engage them to get contact information. They are working with Colleen and Pat explaining the parking regulations, we have a lot going on Runyon, East Ave and Barnegat Lane. Some challenging spots that will be under a build, Herbert and Rt. 35, specifically. So we will be partnering with everybody and asking everybody to to work with us. Give us a call so we can come up with a plan so that we don't disrupt our unique summers here, so everyone can have a safe enjoyable summer. We had a great LEPC meeting which is a local emergency planning committee with the Yacht Club and they opened our eyes that the numbers for them are increased greatly for participation in not only the childrens programs but the adults attendance and applications to the club. Beach badges are on pre-sale now. We are taking forms through the mail and also allowing people to drop off forms in the tax box downstairs. Monday, Wednesday, Friday they are sold from the Police Department window, Tuesday and Thursday out of the Finance Department window and on weekends starting in May we will have somebody here downstairs in the box at the badge shed, so they will be available on the weekends in May to let everyone get the pre-sales price which is \$80.00, verses the \$95 price that goes on sale the week after Memorial Day.

Councilwoman O'Mealia had a question for Chief Ferris, she noticed the buoys are out in the channel – thank you. Chief Ferris responded that is actually Joe Celantano who has been working diligently with the retired New Jersey State Trooper. The barrels come from weights and measures and needs of navigation and the two of them has been working closely and we put them in contact last year. There is an audit that goes on with the buoys, so they have been doing a great job. It is the beginning of the season, everybody has been getting ready.

Councilwoman O'Mealia asked for an update on the new boat and the old boat.

Chief Ferris explained that the Ocean County Sheriff's Department was by to look at the boat to transfer into their custody. They are waiting for some additional information. Right now there is a shortage for engines all over the State of New Jersey. If this is the case, they have been asked to move it by May 1<sup>st</sup>. If they choose not to, we have been granted permission from the State Police to go ahead and list it at auction. The money would have to come back into public safety homeland security as that is where it came from. We are working diligently on that. The new hull has been done for the boat, it is on its way. The issue is right now Yamaha is experiencing huge shortage with engines. Because everybody wants to be on the water. We are hopeful we will see the boat Mid July. However, until Yamaha gives an update on the dealer, we won't have a better understanding. We are trying to see if we can switch to a different engine, however we are very specific on what we can put as far as horse power on this. We can't go too high and some of the other dealers are 95 instead of 105 where we are currently. We are working on that now to get it here in a timely fashion for summer.

Chief Ferris initial way was to transfer it to the Ocean County Sheriff's dept with the understanding that they would continue to help us out when we have a lot of regattas. That they would spend more time in the north end of the county and perhaps take up a slip up here to help service Bay Head and Bricktown where there is a deficiency in marine presence.

Councilwoman O'Mealia inquired about the road work in Brick and Mantoloking Road and if the project will pause over the summer. Chief Ferris reported that it is our understanding is that they are approaching their end spot which is that new gas line that went across the bay. There is a sub-station that was created. It should be done before the season, the question is when will the paving get done. Whether that will be done before summer and that is a great question that we can ask Larry to reach out to the county engineers to get a defined answer to pass out to everybody.

Councilwoman O'Mealia asked Scott Hulse about the Downer ramp. He reported that as of last week he spoke with Frank from Mott MacDonald and he will be coming down to speak with him and do the beach tour. There needs to be so much sand to be able to build up.

Frank hasn't seen the beach but he feels that it may be closer to sometime in May that we will build that repair. By Memorial Day at the latest. We have to wait for mother nature to work with us with the sand. We are shortening the one length that we lost. It will still be ADA compliant.

Joann Lygas, 970 Barnegat Lane asked for clarification on Ord 723, page 14 number 2.

Borough Attorney Cipriani noted it is confusing because it is responding to some very confusing legislation. There needs to be a distinction under the legislation between people under the age of 21 and then for people over the age of 21. The only ability that we have is the ability to make it unlawful for a person over that age to consume and then this language comes directly from the legislation. Other than by smoking vaping or aerosolizing any cannabis item in public place including indoor place. Why would you exclude smoking, vaping and aerosolizing which are the most common ways for the cannabis to be consumed and the answer to that is because it comes directly from the legislation. It is not an enormously effective prohibition because the legislation specifically allows people over the age of 21 and prohibits towns from restricting that to smoke, vape or aerosolize cannabis items in public places. There is another ordinance that we will be discussing that comes under the smoke free air act that in certain designated areas if you prohibit the smoking or tobacco products you can also prohibit in those same areas. That is an area by area type of ordinance and not as general as this one. She cannot take responsibility for that distinction that the legislation makes.

Joann Lygas, 970 Barnegat Lane, thought that New Jersey law forbid over 21 smoking in public places.

Borough Attorney Cipriani responded no, that is not correct, the smoke free air act referenced before what that act does which is separate from this recent legislation is to say that municipality may designate certain areas. It is common if you have a publically owned beach which is is an interesting question in Mantoloking. Certainly in a public park, a lot of towns would prohibit smoking of any kind and it is a reasonable assumption that you can extend that to not allowing smoking of cannabis. But it is not accurate to say generally you cannot smoke in a public place in New Jersey, that is not true.

Joann Lygas, 970 Barnegat Lane, thinks they outlaw smoking on the beach.

Chief noted that there is no smoking on the beach. Some concerns are the parking spots by the tennis courts. Some of our issues and concerns that we will be having to deal with this season. It will be a challenging summer, a different summer for us. We are doing a lot of education internally on this topic and we are trying everytime they change the legislation and we are asking for more changes on it. It doesn't make sense for anyone to smoke or cannabis in the car where you have kids in close proximity playing tennis or even other adults playing tennis. We ask for everybody's patince. Please partner with us. Unfortunately if you smell it you can call us but there is gonna be an occasion where we will show up and unfortunately there is nothing we can do. They are adults and they are allowed to smoke.
