Discussion Item: Recodification and Executive Summaries

Councilwoman Benz-

- On Friday an email went out providing a link to the website where people could download and look at the executive summary of what had occurred in each chapter that we made available.
- The plan is that all of the recodification chapters will be introduced in an ordinance in November giving the public ample time to take a look.
- Only chapters that are not available, Cable (being introduced tonight), Land Use and Flooding. We will make those chapters available during our October meeting and field questions at that time.

Matthew Donohue, Esq.

- Make sure we are transparent
- Recodification is like any other ordinance, needs an introduction at one meeting and an adoption at 2nd meeting.
- 20 chapters have been released to the public (222 pages)
- Available to answer any questions. This will be a 4 month process. More ordinances will be added in October and November.
- If everything goes well and passes in December, they would be effective January 1st.
- Councilwoman Benz also noted that chapter numbers are not as they will be presented in November. We do not want to change some of the numbers particularly: beaches and boating
- Matthew Donohue, Esq. any subtenant changed, the public will be made aware.

- Councilwoman Benz please read the executive summary that falls after the Q&A's on that document that is on the website.
- Councilman Nelson-" Barbara and her team have done an unbelievable job which is beyond belief. Everyone who has been involved in this, thank you very much".
- J.O. Bay Avenue: asked if questions comments should be sent in advance of the public hearing and if so, how should they be disseminated. Matthew Donohue, Esq, noted as soon as possible and to email Beverley.

PUBLIC COMMENT- On agenda items only

- J.O. Bay Avenue: Comcast ordinance, Section 3 public hearings having been held. Could not find any record of that since 2016. Borough Attorney Cipriani responded that the 2016 hearings count. 10 year contract. We will be doing this again in two years.
- C.B. Barnegat Lane: Comcast Ordinance 2023-11 encourages council to investigate alternatives to Comcast. Thinks better options such as fiber optics should be considered. Borough Attorney Cipriani advised that nothing is prohibiting fiber optics from coming in.
- J..L. Barnegat Lane: Thanked the council for re-evaluating the proposed bulkhead ordinance. Thinks this is the right decision by looking at it further.

- Councilman Nelson reported that Ordinance 2023-10 "Bulkheads" would be postponed due to the need for further review and edits. The Ordinance will be reintroduced at a later date. Comments received from residents and Councilman Conti urging the Borough to take a better look at this in the context of overall flood Mitigation Plan. The Flood Mitigation Plan report that Larry Plevier put together with Lynn O'Mealia was comprehensive. It laid out all the things that should be done including raising the bulkheads. They waited a long and finally said it is time to introduce the bulkhead ordinance. They received some reaction to it.
- Councilman Amarante thought maybe they should look at the whole Flood Mitigation Plan and update it including bulkheads. Place a time frame on it and then move forward with a more actionable plan. He further noted that they have done some things already which are pretty impressive like the Barnegat Lane and Pumpstation project which will be a win, win and help everyone south of the bridge on Bay Avenue. We need to look at a lot of other things here too.
- Councilman Nelson- Form a task force which will be made up and led by Councilman Batcha and Councilman Conti and hopefully involved some citizens and the Bay Head Mayor. Hopefully that is a start of something that can expand the whole barrier island. This is the barrier islands number one challenge. We have to come back in six months with a report and move forward.
- Clerk Konopada reported that Councilman Conti had prepared a statement for the public hearing which was cancelled.
- Councilman Batcha echoed Councilman Nelson's thoughts. Critically important thing to do on the barrier island. Mantoloking needs to lead by example. Bulkhead ordinance does not cost anything, it is just something we have to do.

Councilman Amarante commented on the Emergency Vehicle Authorization.

- Issue with new vehicles and computer chip shortages
- We ordered two vehicles last year, one which just went into service a Tahoe and the other one was an Explorer hybrid which we ordered on September 6, 2022. That vehicle is still on order it has no production date scheduled yet.
- Other situation that has occurred is because they are producing less vehicles, the manufacturers are severely eliminating the amount of fleet vehicles that they are building because they make less money on fleet vehicles.

• The understanding is that there will be an ability to place an order for 2024 vehicles sometime in late September or early October. This vehicle will not be produced or get here before the end of this year. It will be funded in next year's budget.

WHEREAS, the total amount of the emergency appropriations created, including the appropriation to be created by this resolution is \$75,000.00 and three (3) percent of the total operating appropriations in the budget for 2023 is \$200,298.81; and

WHEREAS, the foregoing appropriation together with prior appropriations does not exceed three (3) percent of the total operating appropriations in the budget for 2023.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED (not less than two-thirds of all governing body members affirmatively concurring) that in accordance with the provisions of NJSA 40A:4-48;

- 1. An emergency appropriation is hereby made for the following: Purchase of Police Vehicles \$75,000.00
- 2. That said emergency appropriation shall be provided for in full in the 2024 budget.
- 3. That two (2) certified copies of this resolution will be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Governmental Services.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AUTHORIZING THE PREPARATION OF BID SPECIFICATIONS FOR THE BAY AVENUE AND ARNOLD STREET IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT, CONTRACT NO. 2023-1

WHEREAS, the Borough will be rehabilitating the existing roadway surface for a section of Bay Avenue and for Arnold Street along with a proposed new municipal storm sewer interconnection to the NJDOT storm sewer infrastructure within Downer Avenue in the Borough of Mantoloking under Contract No. 2023-1; and

WHEREAS, since the estimated construction costs for the Bay Avenue and Arnold Street Improvements project, Contract No. 2023-1, exceeds \$17,500.00, the project must be publicly bid in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq., specifically N.J.S.A. 40A:11-21; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the governing body to advertise for and receive bids for the proposed roadway and storm sewer improvements under Contract No. 2023-1 and further to authorize the Borough Engineer to prepare the Contract Documents, including the bid specifications and construction drawings, for the receipt of bids for same.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the governing body of the Borough of Mantoloking, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey as follows:

- 1. That the governing body does hereby authorize the preparation of Contract Documents and the subsequent receipt of bids for the proposed roadway and storm sewer improvements under Contract No. 2023-1 to be performed by the Borough Engineer and/or other appropriate Borough personnel. The Borough shall determine the time, date, and place for the receipt of said bids.
- 2. That the Borough Engineer and/or other appropriate Borough personnel are hereby authorized to prepare the Contract Documents, including the bid specifications and construction drawings, for the Bay Avenue and Arnold Street Improvements project.
 - 3. That a notice to bidders shall be published in regard to the receipt of bids for

Contract No. 2023-1 in accordance with the specifications prepared by the Borough Engineer.

4. That a certified copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to the Chief

Financial Officer, Borough Administrator, and the Borough Engineer.

Administration-Chairwoman Barbara Benz

- Recodification has taken up a great deal of time over last several months, coming to fruition.
- Records management progress has slowed down. 5 more boxes have been gone through verifying what is in them, verifying that is it is listed on the online data base, so we can go forward and destroy these boxes as appropriate
- Working on professional services RFP's. On schedule for a resolution in October introducing those RFP's.
- Environmental Commission -we do have another showing of Drift planning. Drift is Save Barnegat Bay's 50th anniversary film Friday, October 20th at the Mantoloking Yacht Club. This is an important film. This is open to the community.
- Beach clean-up with Clean Ocean Action schedule for Saturday, October 21st. Meets at Lyman Street.

Finance-Chairman Anthony Amarante

- Preparing to start the 2024 budget
- 2023 budget- Doing well and is on pace expense wise in most categories. The only revenue item we are little bit short on is construction fees.
- Once we get bids out for Downer Avenue Pump Station, we will discuss how we will finance this project.
- Audit review with outside auditors. Everything look good. We introduced our budget early last year and we fully intend to do this again this year.

Land Use-Chairman Brad Batcha

Council President Nelson has been a major part of this committee. He has handled all the flood work, and he put is so much work and accomplished a lot on the Land Use Committee, specifically with the Flood Mitigation efforts. This is his las meeting here. We wish him well and thank him for all his efforts. We all appreciated it.

Public Safety-Chairman Doug Nelson

- We made it through another summer. This is a compliment to all the police force and everybody that supports them.
- We had no major accidents, no major incidents on the beach. This has to do with so much of your leadership Chief Ferris and also by having a really great lifeguard crew out there and people that care. Congratulations on another season.

Public Works-Chairman Joseph Celentano

• Tree wrapping clarification from Darrin Terrizzi, Code Enforcement Officer - Brick allows individual trees to be wrapped only. 6' maximum height. They pose a safety risk to the public. When trees are wrapped together, it becomes an issue.

- Incredible job of breaking down of the beach, completed with lifeguard chairs, portable bathrooms, walkways. They have done an exceptional job this summer, especially being shorthanded.
- October operations will begin soon which involves cleaning the catch basins. Please be cognizant they will be working on narrow streets please slow down.
- November 3rd, Dune Grass will be happening through Public Works.
- Scott Hulse hoping BTMUA can schedule us for October to do the sewer cleaning up on 35 past Herbert Street to Lyman.

Recreation-Chairman John Conti - No Report- Absent

 - 2. Really proud of the flooding projects. Looking forward to seeing what happens with the pump station. If it works, we set a precedent for the whole barrier island

One of his biggest accomplishments is learning how to operate in the public environment. It is slow and tedious and necessary and he also learned patience. Bay Head looking into applying the same application that we did to apply to the DOT to tie into their pump station. We try to lead the way. Enjoyed working with you. You provided a lot of guidance and counsel and mediation and it worked we got to where we needed to go in many areas. Thank you for that leadership.

L.O. Bay Avenue: Thought we had approved funding for the tie in project. Councilman Amarante responded we did, it is just a matter of exactly how we will raise the money.
