Synopsis: Reduction of Setback for Corner Lots in R 3-B & R 3-C Zoning Districts

ORDINANCE NO. 673

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, OCEAN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY, AMENDING CHAPTER XXX, OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, LAND USE REGULATIONS, PROVIDING FOR REDUCTION OF SIDE YARD SETBACKS FOR CORNER LOTS IN R3-B AND R3-C

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mantoloking, as follows:

- 1. The corner lot side yard setback for corner lots in the R-3B and R-3C zoning districts shall be and hereby are amended by reduction of the side yard setback from 25 feet to 15 feet.
- 2. Appendix B, Bulk Standards, (Zoning Table) shall be and hereby is modified accordingly.
- 3. All provisions of Chapter XXX not specifically amended hereby shall remain in full force and effect.
- 4. This Ordinance shall be effective upon final adoption according to law.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, OCEAN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY, PROVIDING FOR ADOPTION OF CHAPTERS 1, 2 AND 3 OF THE 2015 INTERNATIONAL PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE, AS MODIFIED HEREIN, THE PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mantoloking, as follows:

- 1. Chapters 1, 2 and 3 of the 2015 International Property Maintenance Code, as modified or supplemented herein, are hereby adopted and/or incorporated by reference, as the Property Maintenance Code of the Borough of Mantoloking for regulating the condition and maintenance of all property, buildings and structures, to insure that structures are safe, sanitary and fit for occupation and use and providing for enforcement and the collection of fees and penalties.
- 2. All existing Borough Ordinances or portions thereof, which are in conflict with this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such conflict.
- 3. In the event that any portion or provision of this Ordinance is held to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.
- 4. This Ordinance shall be effective upon final adoption.

Council President White discussed beach replenishment and the preconstruction meetings that are held every Tuesday morning. Representatives from the Army Corp., NJDEP, Weeks Marine Contractor and various town officials meet to discuss the current status of the project and what can be expected for the coming week.

He introduced representatives from the project, Kelley Staffieri, Project Manager, NJDEP- Bureau of Coastal Engineering and Keith Watson, Project Manager, Army Corp.

Keith Watson

Project has begun

Dredge started putting sand on the beach

50,000 cubic yards pumping intermittently at the end of Herbert

Weekly meetings not open to the public

Residents urged to refrain from approaching contractor and Army Corp personal-contact town officials

Safety is a priority

70 days of pumping (base bid) option areas may be done at the end of the contract

2 additional dredges to arrive the end of December beginning of January

The Beach Replenishment Project is the single largest project at one time the Army Corp has ever done.

Councilman Rzemieniewski asked if the Army Corp would finish all of Mantoloking before they leave town.

Council President White explained different factors that prohibit the contractor from taking too much sand from the borrow sight. Sand needs to be left to rebuild itself and protect the fisheries.

Councilwoman O'Mealia requested a timeframe for the completion of Mantoloking replenishment. Parking on Rt.35 prior to the completion of the project
