She also asked how the three comments received regarding the Dune and Beach Ordinance would be incorporated into the Ordinance.

Councilwoman O'Mealia also wanted to know if the Dune Consultant was separate from the Dune Inspector.

Councilman Nelson said almost all of the comments have been incorporated in the ordinance. Stockton University- Dr. Stewart Farrell is our Dune Consultant and Mott MacDonald is our Dune Inspector.
