The regular monthly meeting of the Mayor and Council was held this day in the Mantoloking Yacht Club, Mantoloking, New Jersey.

- 1. <u>CALL TO ORDER:</u> Mayor George C. Nebel called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.
- **2. OPEN PUBLIC MEETING STATEMENT**: Mayor George C. Nebel read the following statement:

In compliance with the provisions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, adequate notice of this meeting of the Mantoloking Borough Council has been advertised in the manner provided by law.

- 5. RESOLUTION NO. 05/17/2016-01: MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS

**RESOLVED**, the Mantoloking Borough Council approved the following minutes as printed and distributed.

Councilwoman Nelson moved to approve the minutes as distributed. The motion was seconded by Councilman Strohm and approved by unanimous voice vote.

7. <u>PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE</u>, Councilwoman Nelson presented reports from the Public Works Superintendent, Construction Official, and Land Use Officer and moved the following resolutions. The motion was seconded by Councilman Strohm and approved by unanimous voice vote.

# A. RESOLUTION NO. 05/17/2016-02: CHANGE ORDER # 1 RESTORATION OF VARIOUS ROADWAYS (CONTRACT 2015-2)

**WHEREAS,** the Borough has entered into a Contract with Earle Asphalt Company, Inc. (Contract 2015-2); and

WHEREAS, the work proposed under contract Change Order # 1 is to complete reconstruction of the DPW Garage Parking lot as allocated under a FEMA project worksheet as part of Superstorm Sandy recovery effort.

WHEREAS, the scope of the work includes excavation and removal of the existing parking lot; installation of dense graded aggregate base course, hot mix asphalt base and surface courses, and parking striping and the contractors field survey and stakeout for the improvements.

WHEREAS, the Contractor has submitted a Change Order #1 in the sum of \$33,533.50; and WHEREAS, the Borough Engineer, Lawrence Plevier, P.E. (Hatch Mott MacDonald) has recommended change order #1 be approved, now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, the Mantoloking Borough Council hereby approves the overall raise in contract price.

#### C. RESOLUTION NO. 05/17/2016-04: PROVIDING FOR PURCHASE OF SAND

WHEREAS, Hatch Mott and MacDonald (Robert C. Mainberger, P.E., C.M.E.) has, by letters dated May 16, 2016, advised that the public safety would be enhanced by expedited placement of sand-fill between Herbert Street and Downer Avenue, that the existing condition is hazardous (8' deep) and renders access to the beach at this location difficult and hazardous, especially to children; and

WHEREAS, it is recommended that sand be imported and utilized to alleviate the existing conditions; and

WHEREAS, the delayed natural return of sand is unlikely to occur in advance of the summer season; and

WHEREAS, Robert C. Mainberger, P. E., C.M.E. has recommended the immediate implementation

of a sand import project on an emergency basis; and

WHEREAS, it is his opinion that the importation project could be completed within three (3) weeks, in advance of the summer season; and

WHEREAS, the delays inherent in reliance upon the public bid process would inhibit timely completion of the project; and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that 75% of the costs will be recovered through the FEMA Public Assistance Program and that the remaining 25% would be eligible for reimbursement by the State of New Jersey (NJDEP); and

WHEREAS, 5,850 cubic yards is necessary to stabilize the dune system and alleviate the safety concerns; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that the Borough's share (25%) would range from \$21,264.75 to \$31,596.00; and

**WHEREAS**, the recommendation of the engineering firm has been provided to the Chief Financial Officer in the context of the need for purchase of sand as an emergency contract; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer is satisfied that an emergency exits; and

WHEREAS, the need for such purchase of sand could not have been reasonably foreseen, notwithstanding the efforts of the Borough to address the issue utilizing naturally available sand in an ongoing good faith manner.

**IT IS NOW, THEREFORE**, this 17th day of May, 2016, **RESOLVED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mantoloking, Ocean County, New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. All of the forgoing prefatory statements and the engineer's letters are incorporated as substantive components of this Resolution.
- 2. Purchase of sand is authorized and ratified.
- 3. The Chief Financial Officer shall sign any contract for this purpose without public bidding and in accordance with specifications and quantity as recommended by the engineer;
- 4. The Borough shall seek such reimbursement from FEMA and/or the State of New Jersey as will be available for this purpose.

**Sponsored by:** April Yezzi **Date introduced:** May 17, 2016 **Public Hearing:** June 22, 2016

**Synopsis:** The purpose of this ordinance is to authorize exceeding the 2016 Municipal

Budget Appropriation limits and to establish a cap bank.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 657

### ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE 2016 MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATIONS LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit an increase in said budget to 2.50% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mantoloking in the County of Ocean finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2016 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council hereby determined that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$130,910.50 of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to the final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mantoloking in the County of Ocean, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2016 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Mantoloking shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5% amounting to \$130,910.50 and the CY 2016 municipal budget for the Borough of Mantoloking be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said director within 5 days after such adoption.

# F. <u>RESOLUTION NO. 05/17/2016-10 : ADOPTION OF BOND ORDINANCE # 656 FOR CONSTRUCTION OF MUNICIPAL BUILDING</u>

**WHEREAS,** on this 17<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2016, a public hearing on Ordinance No. 656 was held and no comments were made by the public.

IT IS NOW, THEREFORE this 17th day of May, 2016,

**RESOLVED**, The Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mantoloking, Ocean County, New Jersey hereby adopts the following Bond ordinance:

"BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW MUNICIPAL BUILDING IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$5,500,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$5,500,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF".

1. The Ordinance was introduced by title, at the Regular Council Meeting held on April 26, 2016 at the Mantoloking Yacht Club. Posted and published according to law.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Borough of Mantoloking, in the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "Borough") as a general improvement. For the improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a), there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$5,500,000, including \$1,100,000 in Federal Emergency Management Agency reimbursements and/or insurance proceeds (the "FEMA Proceeds"). No down payment is required pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11(c) as this bond ordinance authorizes obligations solely for a purpose described in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-7(d).

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the improvement or purpose and in anticipation of receipt of the FEMA Proceeds, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$5,500,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

- Section 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for the financing of which the bonds are to be issued is the construction of a new municipal building, including all work and materials necessary therefor and incidental thereto. (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the improvement or purpose is as stated in Section 2 hereof.
- (c) The estimated cost of the improvement or purpose is equal to the amount of the appropriation herein made therefor.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no bond anticipation note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time

subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The Borough hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The improvement or purpose described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance is not a current expense. It is an improvement or purpose that the Borough may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.
- (b) The period of usefulness of the improvement or purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 30 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in

the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$5,500,000, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$500,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purpose or improvement.
- (e) This bond ordinance authorizes obligations of the Borough solely for a purpose described in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-7(d). This purpose is in the public interest and is for the health, welfare, convenience or betterment of the inhabitants of the Borough. The amounts to be expended for this purpose pursuant to this bond ordinance are not unreasonable or exorbitant, and the issuance of the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will not materially impair the credit of the Borough or substantially reduce its ability to pay punctually the principal of and the interest on its debts and to supply other essential public improvements and services. The Local Finance Board in the Division of Local Government Services of the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey has heretofore made a determination to this effect and has caused its consent to be endorsed upon a certified copy of this bond ordinance as passed upon first reading.

Section 7. The Borough hereby declares the intent of the Borough to issue bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use the proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance. This Section 7 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of Treasury Regulations.

Section 8. Any grant moneys received for the purpose described in Section 3 hereof, including the FEMA Proceeds, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvement or

to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 9. The chief financial officer of the Borough is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Borough and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Borough. The chief financial officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Borough pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Borough and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Borough fails to comply with its undertaking, the Borough shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 11. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.
