The regular monthly meeting of the Mayor and Council was held this day in the Mantoloking Yacht Club, Mantoloking, New Jersey.

- 1. <u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: Council President Ann Elizabeth Nelson called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.
- **2. OPEN PUBLIC MEETING STATEMENT**: Council President Nelson read the following statement:

In compliance with the provisions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act, adequate notice of this meeting of the Mantoloking Borough Council has been advertised in the manner provided by law.

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:** Council President Nelson led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

## RESOLUTION NO. 03/17/2015 - 01: MEMORIALIZATION OF CONTRIBUTIONS AND PUBLIC SERVICE OF ELBERT E. HUSTED, III

WHEREAS, Elbert E. Husted, III "Rusty" served as a Member of the Borough Council for eighteen years; and

WHEREAS, his service included long-term leadership of the Public Safety and Beach Committees; and

WHEREAS, he early recognized the need to maintain and improve dunes and beaches against the real threat of devastating storms; and

WHEREAS, he was vigilant and very proactive in pursuit of programs, projects and recognition of the need to enlist aid of all levels of government; and WHEREAS, he initiated and advanced the campaign to promote and accelerate a U. S. Army Corps of Engineers dune replenishment project for northern Ocean County; and

WHEREAS, his initiative was a major catalyst for inclusion of the area into project plans for the now imminent beach restoration construction; and

WHEREAS, his effective leadership and commitment to dune and beach replenishment in Mantoloking have been recognized by the New Jersey DEP; and WHEREAS, his foresight and dedicated public service was exemplary, the results of which will inure to the benefit of the Borough and the public at large.

## A. <u>RESOLUTION NO. 03/17/2-15 - 03: PAYMENT NO. 22- EMERGENCY BYPASS PUMPING SYSTEM (CONTRACT 2013-01)</u>

WHEREAS, the Borough has entered into a Contract with Municipal Maintenance Co. (Contract 2013-01) to provide Emergency Bypass Pumping System; and

WHEREAS, the Contractor has submitted Payment Application No.22, in the sum of \$\$30,447.62 and

WHEREAS, the Borough Engineer, Lawrence Plevier, P.E. (Hatch Mott MacDonald) has recommended Payment Application No.22 be paid, now, therefore, be it RESOLVED, the Mantoloking Borough Council hereby approves payment of the claim.

## B. RESOLUTION NO. 03/17/2015 - 04: PAYMENT NO. 1 – HERBERT STREET PUMP STATION RECONSTRUCTION (CONTRACT 2014-04)

WHEREAS, the Contractor has submitted Payment Application No.1 in the sum of \$42,630.00 and

WHEREAS, the Borough Engineer, Lawrence Plevier, P.E. (Hatch Mott MacDonald) has recommended Payment Application No.1 be paid, now, therefore, be it **RESOLVED**, the Mantoloking Borough Council hereby approves payment of the claim.

## C. <u>RESOLUTION NO. 03/17/2015 - 05: CHANGE ORDER # 6 RELOCATION OF EMERGENCY BYPASS PUMPING SYSTEM (CONTRACT 2013-01)</u>

WHEREAS, the Borough has entered into a Contract with Municipal Maintenance Co. (Contract 2013-01) to provide for the emergency bypass pumping system; and

WHEREAS, due to the need for the relocation of the emergency bypass prior to the start of the reconstruction project (contract 2014-04), the contractor has submitted change order # 6, in the sum of \$10,419.00 and

WHEREAS, the Borough Engineer, Lawrence Plevier, P.E. (Hatch Mott MacDonald) has recommended change order #6 p ayment be paid, now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED,** the Mantoloking Borough Council hereby approves payment of the claim.

## D. <u>RESOLUTION NO. 03/17/2015 - 06: PROVIDING FOR ADOPTION OF "THE FLOOD MITIGATION PLAN FOR THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING"</u>

WHEREAS, the Borough of Mantoloking has experienced severe damage from hurricanes, and flooding, on many occasions in the past century, resulting in property loss, loss of life, economic hardship, and threats to public health and safety; and WHEREAS, a Flood Mitigation Plan, revised as of January, 2015, (the Plan) has been approved by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) as is evidenced by the confirmatory letter dated November 7, 2008, wherein the State of New Jersey,

Division of State Police, Emergency Management Section, advised of the fact of FEMA approval; and

WHEREAS, the Plan recommends many hazard mitigation actions that will protect the people and property affected by the natural hazards that face Mantoloking; and WHEREAS, a public meeting was held to review the Plan as required by law. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Mantoloking, Ocean County, New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. The Flood Mitigation Plan, revised as of January, 2015, is hereby adopted as an official Plan of the Borough of Mantoloking.
- 2. The respective Borough officials identified in the strategy of the Plan are hereby directed to implement the recommended actions assigned to them. These officials will meet and report quarterly on their activities, accomplishments, and progress to the Flood Mitigation Planning Committee.
- 3. The Flood Mitigation Planning Committee will provide annual progress reports on the status of implementation of the Plan to the Mayor and Borough Council. This report shall be submitted to the Borough Council by September 1st of each year.
- **8. FINANCE COMMITTEE**, Councilman Gillingham presented the monthly finance report and moved the following seven resolutions. The motion was seconded by Councilman Strohm and approved by unanimous voice vote.

## A. <u>RESOLUTION NO. 03/17/2015 - 07: TO ADOPT APPROPRIATION RESERVE TRANSFER #3</u>

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-59 provides that in the first 3 months of the fiscal year, the amount of any appropriation reserve for the immediately preceding fiscal year is insufficient to pay the claims authorized or incurred during said preceding year which were chargeable to said appropriation, and there shall be an excess in any appropriation reserves over and above the amount deemed to be necessary to fulfill its purpose, the governing body may, by resolution adopted by not less than a 2/3 vote of the full membership thereof, transfer the amount of such excess to an appropriation reserve or an appropriation in the prior budget deemed to be insufficient to fulfill its purpose or for which no reserve was provided.

**WHEREAS**, the Chief Financial Officer has advised the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mantoloking that the need for certain transfers within the 2014 Appropriation Reserves exists; and

WHEREAS, it is recommended that these appropriation reserve transfers be made; NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the Borough of Mantoloking that the following budget transfers be made for the 2014 Appropriation Reserve balances

## A. RESOLUTION NO. 03/17/52015 -17: RECYCLING ENHANCEMENT ACT TAX IDENTIFICATION STATEMENT 2014

WHEREAS, The Recycling Enhancement Act, P.L. 2007, chapter 311, has established a recycling fund from which tonnage grants may be made to municipalities in order to encourage local source separation and recycling programs; and

WHEREAS, There is levied upon the owner or operator of every solid waste facility (with certain exceptions) a recycling tax of \$3.00 per ton on all solid waste accepted for disposal or transfer at the solid waste facility.

WHEREAS, Whenever a municipality operates a municipal service system for solid waste collection, or provides for regular solid waste collection service under a contract awarded pursuant to the "Local Public Contracts Law", the amount of grant monies received by the municipality shall not be less than the annual amount of recycling tax paid by the municipality except that all grant moneys received by the municipality shall be expended only for its recycling program.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Borough of Mantoloking that the Borough of Mantoloking certifies a submission of expenditure for taxes paid pursuant to P.L. 2007, chapter 311, in 2014 in the amount of \$4,282.92. Documentation supporting this submission is available at 340 Drum Point Road, Brick, New Jersey and shall be maintained for no less than five years from this date.

## B. RESOLUTION NO. 03/17/2015 – 18: SUBMISSION OF ANNUAL RECYCLING REPORT, ANNUAL TONNAGE REPORT AND APPLICATION FOR 2014 TONNAGE GRANT

WHEREAS, the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act, P.L. 1987, c.102, has established a recycling fund from which tonnage grant may be made to municipalities in order to encourage local source separation and recycling programs; and

WHEREAS, It is the intent and the spirit of the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act to use the tonnage grants to develop new municipal recycling programs and to continue and to expand existing programs; and

WHEREAS, The New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection has promulgated recycling regulations to Implement the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act; and

WHEREAS, The recycling regulations impose on municipalities certain requirements as a condition for applying for tonnage grants, including but not limited to, making and keeping accurate, verifiable records of materials collected and claimed by the municipality; and

WHEREAS, A resolution authorizing this municipality to apply for the 2014

Recycling Tonnage Grant will memorialize the commitment of this municipality to recycling and to indicate the assent of the Mayor and Council to the efforts undertaken by the Borough of Mantoloking and the requirements contained in the Recycling Act and recycling regulations; and

WHEREAS, such a resolution should designate the individual authorized to ensure the application is properly completed and timely filed.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mantoloking endorses the submission of the recycling tonnage grant application to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and designates Jude Walker, Certified Recycling Professional to ensure that the application is properly filed; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the monies received from the recycling tonnage grant be deposited in a dedicated recycling trust fund to be used solely for the purposes of recycling.
