INTRODUCTION TO ORDINANCE NO. 695

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF THE DEED OF DEDICATION AND PERPETUAL PUBLIC ACCESS EASEMENT

WHEREAS, the Borough is the owner or easement holder of certain tracts of land identified as public accessways to tidal waterways; and

WHEREAS, as part of the Municipal Public Access Plan, which the Borough is required to file with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, the Borough identified several public access ways to tidal waterways, and is required by NJDEP rules to dedicate the lands via a Perpetual Public Access Easement; and WHEREAS, the Borough wishes to grant a perpetual deed of easement, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof as "Schedule A," across the subject property to the State of New Jersey.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the governing body of the Borough of Mantoloking, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. That the governing body does hereby authorize the dedication of a Deed of Dedication and Perpetual Public Access Easement to the State of New Jersey attached hereto as Schedule "A."

SECTION 2. That the Mayor and the Municipal Clerk are hereby authorized to execute and attest to, respectively, any and all documents necessary to facilitate the transfer of the above-mentioned easement in a form acceptable to the Borough Attorney.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4 If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by law.

INTRODUCTION TO ORDINANCE NO. 696

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE BOROUGH CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, SO AS TO AMEND CHAPTER 30 ENTITLED "LAND USE REGULATIONS."

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Mantoloking, County of Ocean, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Municipal Code of the Borough of Mantoloking is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 30, entitled "Land Use Regulations," so as to amend § 30-6.11 entitled "Accessory Use and Accessory Structures" so as to amend subsection (b) entitled "Accessory Structures" so as to amend subsection 7. in its entirety so that it shall read as follows:

- 7. On-grade air conditioning or HVAC units shall be located within the building envelope and must be landscaped or screened with lattice, open board fence, shrubbery and/or plantings, which still allows for the circulation of air and dispersal of fumes, as to lessen the visual impact of the unit(s).
 - a. Mechanical and utility platforms servicing the building, including generator platforms, shall be located within the building envelope, not more than six (6) inches from the principal structure and be considered a part of the building footprint and must be landscaped or screened with lattice, open board fence, shrubbery and/or plantings, which still allows for the circulation of air and dispersal of fumes, as to lessen the visual impact of the unit(s).

b. Roof mounted equipment on an accessory or principal structure must be recessed into the rooflines to entirely screen the units and shall be located within the building envelope. The open end of the recessed roof platform at the roofline for the mechanical equipment shall be adequately screened with lattice, a parapet wall, or similar architectural elements along the roof line, which will still allow for the circulation of air and dispersal of any fumes, to lessen the visual impact and screen the roof mounted unit(s). No part or section of the platforms for roof mounted mechanical equipment shall extend above or beyond the structure's roofline.

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect after second reading and publication as required by law.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF
MANTOLOKING AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT WITH COTTER STRATEGIES,
LLC FOR THE PROVISION OF AN ORGANIZATIONAL REVIEW AND
MANAGEMENT REPORT

WHEREAS, there exists a need for an Organizational Review and Management Report to review municipal operations for the alignment of best practices and to make recommendations for staffing and the performance of a salary survey; and

WHEREAS, Cotter Strategies, LLC is duly qualified to provide the organizational and management review services to the Borough;

WHEREAS, Cotter Strategies has provided a proposal to the Borough dated September 9, 2019 to provide said services;

WHEREAS, the Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq. authorizes the award of contracts for "Professional Services" without competitive bids; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the governing body to appoint Cotter Strategies, LLC to complete the Organizational Review and Management Report for the Borough at a cost not to exceed \$ 6,105.00. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Mantoloking, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey as follows:

- 1. That Cotter Strategies, LLC is hereby appointed to provide the Organizational Review and Management Report to the Borough in an amount not to exceed \$6,105.00 in accordance with the proposal which is on file in the Office of the Borough Clerk and can be viewed during normal business hours.
- 2. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute and the Borough Clerk to attest to, respectively, the attached agreement with Cotter Strategies, LLC in accordance with the provisions of this resolution.
- 3. That this resolution shall take effect immediately.
- 4. That a certified copy of this resolution shall be provided by the Borough Clerk to the Chief Financial Officer and Cotter Strategies, LLC.

Mayor White explained that the meeting will start at 5:30 for the Caucus meeting and then go into the Regular Business meeting, both are open to the public.

Councilman Amarante supports this.

Councilman Rzemieniewski discussed bicyclists in town and that teenagers are not wearing helmets. Chief Ferris informed the public know that two bicyclists were hurt in town.

She also mentioned the Seafood festival and the Ma Deuce Duece walk are next weekend and traffic will be bad. Barnegat Lane will have to be shut down. If you have any comments on the beach season to please send an email to her.

The speed limit will be back to 40 mph for fall hours, be mindful of this.

Councilman Batcha feels that there should be more education regarding dunes, and the 4 foot pathways to the ocean should be marked so there is no wondering on the dunes.

Councilman Amarante reported that the beach this summer was fantastic. It was kept very clean.

Councilman Nelson responded that it doesn't make sense to have a 12 minute meetings.

Councilman Nelson asked Mr. Corbet to write down any suggestions and the Borough Attorney, Robin LaBue and Councilman Batcha will take a look at it.

Mayor White suggested that Mr. Corbet send residents to the Zoning office if they have questions, and that this issue is not our call. He also suggested that Mr. Corbet come in and speak with the Construction Official and Zoning Official.

Clerk Konopada let Councilman Batcha know that she would be in contact with Republics regarding the fall garbage pick- up schedule and will be posted on the Borough website.

Mayor White reported that people are putting chairs and tables on the dune which is not allowed. They should come in and get a dune platform permit.

Councilman Rzemieniewski asked about people using the Yacht Club Restroom who are not members.
