6. <u>PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR</u>: Mayor George C. Nebel opened the meeting for public comment and questions about the agenda.

Joann Lygas, 970 Barnegat Lane, asked for an update on Borough Hall. Mayor Nebel asked her to wait until the end of the Agenda.

7. <u>MUNICIPAL SERVICES COMMITTEE</u>, Council President White presented the monthly reports from the Public Works Superintendent, Construction Official, Land Use Officer and Building Committee and moved the following resolutions. The motion was seconded by Councilman Rzemieniewski and approved by unanimous voice vote.

A. <u>RESOLUTION NO. 09/18/2018-02:</u> OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, EXTENDING A CONTRACT WITH GEORGE HARMS CONSTRUCTION CO. INC. FOR EMERGENCY STORM RESPONSE EARTHWORK ACTIVITIES PENDING AWARD OF A NEW CONTRACT

WHEREAS, the Borough of Mantoloking has a need for Emergency Storm Response Services; and **WHEREAS**, bids for such services were received on August 10, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the governing body is expected to award to the apparent low bidder at its meeting of September 18, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the Borough's current contract with George Harms Construction Co, Inc. for Emergency Storm Response Earthwork Activities Services expired on August 31, 2018; and

WHEREAS, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:11-15 allows a contract to be extended by mutual agreement if the rebidding process has already begun; and

WHEREAS, George Harms Construction Co, Inc. has confirmed it will continue to provide Emergency Storm Response Services to the Borough at the prices established pursuant to the contract, Contract No. 2016-1, which expires on August 31, 2018; and

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to ratify the extension of its current contract for thirty (30) days to ensure there is no lapse in emergency services, if needed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the governing body of the Borough of Mantoloking as follows,

- That the governing body does hereby ratify and approve the extension of Contract No. 2016-1, at the prices established for thirty (30) days to ensure there is no lapse in emergency services.
- 2. That this resolution shall be effective as of September 1, 2018.
- 3. A copy of this resolution shall be provided to George Harms Construction Co, Inc., the Chief of Police, Borough Engineer and the Chief Financial Officer.

B. <u>RESOLUTION NO. 09/18/2018-03:</u> OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, <u>COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY APPROVAL OF CONTRACT</u> FOR EMERGENCY STORM RESPONSE SERVICES

CONTRACT NO. 2018-1

WHEREAS, Sealed bids for the supply of equipment, material, and labor during an emergency event for various services and activities for prevention and/or recovery efforts, including various earthwork, debris removal, material screening, clearing roadways of obstructions, snow removal, and other activities as directed at the time by the Office of Emergency Management (OEM) were opened and read aloud on August 10, 2018, with the following results:

One bid received: Yannuzzi Group Inc., Kinnelon, NJ:

For August 2018 - July 2019:

- \$3,000 non-refundable retainer,
- Projected hourly costs to supply and operate various personnel and equipment if and when required and authorized by the mayor or other approved municipal personnel:
 - straight time and overtime for various superintendents, laborers, equipment operators, and truck drivers ranging from \$93 \$183 per hour at an estimated 20 80 hours each,
 - \circ hourly rates to supply and utilize dozers, trucks, loaders, excavators and other equipment if and when required by authorized borough personnel ranging from \$80 \$200 per hour, for an estimated 30 120 hours each,
- Maximum cost estimated by bidder for work performed if and when requested by municipal authorities: \$112,590

For August 2019 -July 2020:

- \$3,000 non-refundable retainer,
- Projected hourly costs to supply and operate various personnel and equipment if and when required and authorized by the mayor or other approved municipal personnel:
 - \circ straight time and overtime for various superintendents, laborers, equipment operators, and truck drivers ranging from \$109 \$210 at an estimated 20 80 hours each,
 - \circ hourly rates to supply and utilize dozers, trucks, loaders, excavators and other equipment if and when required by authorized borough personnel, ranging from \$92 \$230 for an estimated 30 120 hours each,
- Maximum cost estimated by bidder for work performed if and when requested by municipal authorities: \$132,180, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, the Borough Council ... approves a contract with Yannuzzi Group Inc, Kenilworth, NJ to provide emergency storm response services for the period August 2018 – July 2020 at a cost of \$3,000 per year plus personnel and equipment if and when required by Borough officials as itemized on the ten (10) page document entitled "Emergency Storm Response Services" which is on file with the municipal clerk and made part of this resolution by reference.

C. INTRODUCTION OF BOND ORDINANCE # 681

BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING COUNTY OF OCEAN BOND ORDINANCE NO. 681

BOND ORDINANCE REAPPROPRIATING \$253,892 IN EXCESS BOND PROCEEDS NOT NEEDED FOR THEIR ORIGINAL PURPOSES IN ORDER TO FINANCE THE COST OF THE CONSTRUCTION, RELOCATION AND OUTFITTING OF A NEW MUNICIPAL BUILDING, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, NEW JERSEY WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Mantoloking, in the County of Ocean, New Jersey (the "Borough") finally adopted Bond Ordinance No. 581 on April 19, 2010; Bond Ordinance No. 582 on April 19, 2010; Bond Ordinance No. 586 on April 19, 2010; Bond Ordinance No. 598 on April 18, 2011; Bond Ordinance No. 599 on April 18, 2011; Bond Ordinance No. 607 on March 26, 2012; and Bond Ordinance No. 610 on April 23, 2012 (collectively, the "Ordinances"); and

WHEREAS, following the effective dates of the Ordinances, the Borough issued bonds to fully fund same and to finance the improvements or purposes authorized therein; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that the improvements to set forth in the Ordinances have either been completed in full or discontinued as a result of events occurring subsequent to the adoption of the Ordinances, as applicable; and

WHEREAS, there currently remains on deposit in the Borough capital accounts excess bond proceeds in the amount of \$253,892, which excess bond proceeds are allocable to such project improvements in the Ordinances (the "Excess Proceeds"), but are no longer necessary to complete such improvements or purposes authorized therein; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with its statutory powers set forth in section 39 of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. (the "Local Bond Law"), the Borough Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the Borough to reappropriate the Excess Proceeds to finance the cost of the construction, relocation and outfitting of a new municipal building, for which improvements bonds may be issued, thereby, decreasing the amount of additional Borough debt to finance such current capital needs; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council now desires to reappropriate the Excess Proceeds to undertake the cost of the construction, relocation and outfitting of a new municipal building for the Borough.

BE IT ORDAINED by the BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF MANTOLOKING, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It is hereby determined that the aggregate amount of \$253,892 of the balance of the total appropriation for capital purposes originally made available pursuant to the following Ordinances of the Borough is no longer necessary for the purposes for which the obligations previously were authorized:

Section 2. The appropriations for the purposes in the amounts set forth in Section 1 hereof are hereby canceled and reappropriated pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-39 to other capital purposes as set forth in Section 3 hereof.

Section 3. The aggregate amount of \$253,892, representing the amount referred to in Section 1 hereof, is hereby appropriated to provide for the following capital improvement purposes, together with all purposes necessary, incidental or appurtenant thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with plans, specifications or requisitions therefor on file with or through the Borough Clerk, as finally approved by the governing body of the Borough, and the estimated cost the project is as follows:

Amount to be Appropriated	Purpose
<u>\$ 253,892</u>	The construction, relocation and outfitting of a new municipal building.

Section 4. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses and are property or improvements which the Borough may lawfully acquire or make as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The average period of usefulness of said purposes within the limitations of the Local Bond Law and according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance is twenty (20) years.

(c) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$150,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the improvement or purpose herein before described.

Section 5. The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 6. The Borough covenants to maintain the exclusion from gross income under section 103(a) of the Code, of the interest on all bond proceeds reappropriated by this bond ordinance.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption.

Joann Lygas, 970 Barnegat Lane, requested a recent update on financial aspects of the new borough hall. She asked that before a vote is taken to have an updated report and financials available to council and taxpayers before the next agenda setting meeting.

Councilman White attended a meeting with the Mayor and Borough Attorney which resulted in some progress and some solutions.

Borough Attorney Jean Cipriani discussed the bond ordinance amount of \$253,000. If it is not needed, it can be cancelled. It can be used for change orders and relocation costs.

Councilwoman O'Mealia asked if April Yezzi, CFO could tell them roughly how much money is yet to be paid to the contractor.

Councilman Gillingham said there is a comprehensive report. April Yezzi, CFO replied there is a comprehensive report and it was not brought to the meeting.

Jean Cipriani advised that this only a first reading and a vote should be taken. The second reading you will have the report and there will be a public hearing.

Councilwoman O'Mealia explained that report was submitted to Finance Committee. Moving costs, Landscape Costs, Security Systems, meeting room were not a part of the bid package.
