Recycling News and Tips

The 3 'R's are all about minimizing the amount of waste we produce, reusing products as much as we can, and remembering to recycle any materials that can be used for a new purpose.

REDUCE the amount of waste created

- Only buy what you need
- Choose products with less packaging
- Buy in bulk
- Look for items that you can re-use

RECYCLE items whenever possible

- Lightly rinse all plastic, glass, and metal of food debris
- REMEMBER 125! ONLY recycle plastics marked with 1, 2, or 5



- Don't put recycling in plastic bags
- IF IN DOUBT, THROW IT OUT!

REUSE items as much as you can before replacing them

- Refill a water bottle with water from home instead of buying a new one
- Update your computer rather than throwing it out and getting a replacement
- Reuse plastic Ziploc like bags or ditch them altogether and choose reusable, environmentally-friendly bags instead



Recycle Coach



Confused as to Recycling Do's and Don'ts? Download and use Recycle Coach, an app paid for by the State of NJ, which has been customized for Mantoloking's use:

- Ask questions about what can be recycled.
- Determine your Garbage, Recycling, and Bulk Pick-Up calendar.
- Find information on local Shredding and Hazardous Waste disposal events.

Recycling Coach is a free app available for download to your mobile device through the app store.

Mantoloking's Police Boat

Put into service last year, the police boat is a 19' RIB with a T-top that can be operated by one officer. Docked on the south dock of the Mantoloking Yacht Club on a specialized military float, it can be lowered into the water within two minutes with the touch of a button.





While Chief Stacy Ferris has strived to hire officers with the ability and experience to operate the RIB, training for inexperienced officers has been provided by TowBoatUS whose Boat Captains have trained and tested them on maneuvering, docking, and overall operation. Working in collaboration with the NJ State and Brick Police and the Ocean County Sheriff's department, the boat's presence is meant to deter misbehavior along the Mantoloking Barnegat Bay shoreline.

Additionally, the Police Department is committed to working with the Mantoloking Yacht Club's youth sailing program to make every effort to have the police boat in the water during training, races and special events.





The Mantoloking Police started patrolling on the weekends the 1st weekend in June and then on June 21st through Labor Day, five days a week, 6 hours a day from 9 AM to 5 PM, emphasizing weekends.


